The Monterey County AIDS Project (MCAP) and John Twenty-Third AIDS Ministry have combined to form a single organization. Provides free anonymous or confidential HIV testing, including rapid testing with results available in 20 minutes. Drop-in or by appointment. Other services include assistance with food, housing, transportation, counseling, support groups and education on HIV/AIDS. The drop-in center on Market Street in Salinas was closed. A mobile van provides services at Dorothy's Kitchen on M, W, F.

The <u>South County Crisis Center</u>, located in Greenfield, closed in the fall. The <u>YWCA</u> provides domestic violence services to clients throughout the county at the nearest office in Salinas or Monterey. Services are made by appointment only. All appointments are made through the Monterey office. <u>Monterey County Rape Crisis Center</u>, Salinas office, serves domestic violence clients in the south county who are also victims of sexual assault or rape.
